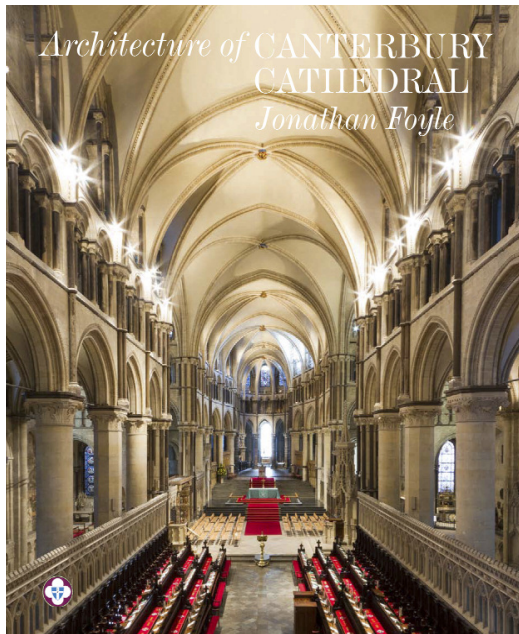

Canterbury Cathedral has been one of Britain's most important buildings for over 1400 years.

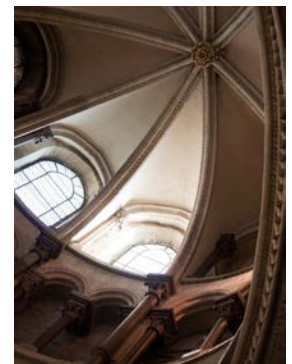
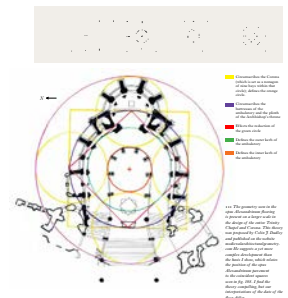
